Draft Environment (Principles and Governance) Bill

The Bill was published on 19.12.18 and focuses on establishing an 'Office for Environmental Protection' to hold public authorities to account after Brexit backed by a statement of environment principles. More content will be added to the Bill including measures to deliver the new Resources and Waste Strategy. A complete Bill is expected by Summer 2019 with Royal Assent potentially by end of 2019. Brexit Update:

Withdrawal Agreement and Political Declaration

An Agreement and Declaration on the future relationship between the UK and EU were agreed in principle on 25.11.18 at a special European Council meeting. However, the deal was rejected by UK MPs in a Parliamentary vote on 15.01.19. Government is working to amend the Agreement / Declaration and plans a further vote by 12.03.19. If the deal is defeated again, MPs will vote on whether to accept a 'no deal' Brexit or apply for an extension to the 29.03.19 Brexit date.

UK Waste Statistics 2017

On 14.02.19 DEFRA released UK waste statistics for 2017. The UK waste from households recycling rate increased by 0.5% to 45.7% with England achieving 45.2%. Actual recycling tonnage decreased slightly, but a 103,000 tonne drop in overall waste arisings resulted in an increased recycling rate. Link to UK Waste Statistics 2017 (pdf 20 pages)
