<p><b>LCR Mayor Policy Announcements</b>            Mayor Rotheram announced <b>new LCR policy pledges</b> on 14.11.17 around:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Renewable energy from a Mersey tidal barrage</li> <li>• Making LCR the most digitally connected region in the UK</li> <li>• A skills revolution including degree level apprenticeships</li> <li>• Building 25,000 new homes by 2022 on brownfield sites and tackling homelessness</li> <li>• Creating a fully integrated, smart public transport system</li> <li>• Future devolution ambitions and integration of additional powers into the Combined Authority.</li> </ul> <p><a href="#">Link to policy pledges announcement</a></p>	<p><b>Modernisation of LCR infrastructure and skills base.</b></p>
<p><b>Mayoral Capacity Fund</b>            Budget 2017 announced a £12 million <b>Mayoral Capacity Fund</b> over the next 2 years to support City Region Mayors (including Liverpool City Region) boost their capacity and resources to deliver for their local area. Government to discuss scope for further devolution with Liverpool City Region.</p>	<p><b>Improved capacity to deliver LCR priorities.</b></p>

<b>NATIONAL</b>	
<p><b>25 Year Environment Plan</b>            The Plan published on 11.01.18 aims to improve the environment within a generation and deliver a 'Green Brexit'. The Plan signals long term commitments on a wide range of issues including resource efficiency. Waste measures focused on plastics including a new pledge to <b>eliminate avoidable plastic waste by 2042</b>. More detail on new waste initiatives is expected in the Resources and Waste Strategy due later in 2018. <p><b>Industrial Strategy White Paper</b>            Government published its vision for transforming the economy through innovation and improved skills, infrastructure and business productivity on 27.11.17. Clean growth (reduced carbon emissions), the circular economy and business resource productivity are all identified as key areas. The Strategy includes a <b>commitment to achieve zero avoidable waste and a doubling of resource productivity by 2050</b>.  <a href="#">Link to Industrial Strategy</a></p>	<p><b>Waste and resource efficiency integrated into long term plans for modernising infrastructure and growing the economy.</b></p>
<p><b>From Waste To Resource Productivity report</b>            Work by the Government Chief Scientific Advisor published on 14.12.17 encourages a <b>more modern waste and resources data regime, circular economy innovation and fairer sharing of financial and behavioural responsibility for waste</b>. Also <b>encourages smarter city region systems to deliver better waste and resource productivity</b>.  <a href="#">Link to report</a></p>	<p><b>Influential on direction of new Resources and Waste Strategy.</b></p>
<p><b>England Waste Statistics 2016-17</b>            In 2016 England achieved a <b>waste from households recycling rate of 44.9%</b>, a slight increase from 2015. <b>Arisings increased by 600,000 tonnes</b> to 22.8 million tonnes or 412kg per person.  <a href="#">Link to waste statistics</a> released 05.12.17.</p>	<p><b>Rising waste arisings and risk of missing 50% 2020 EU / national target.</b></p>
<p><b>Autumn Budget 2017</b>            The 22.11.17 Budget increased the standard rate of <b>landfill tax to £88.95 in April 2018 and to £91.35 from April 2019</b>. <b>A Call for Evidence to be launched in early 2018 on how the tax system or charges could help to reduce the amount of single-use plastics waste</b>. An additional £30 million over the next 4 years for the Environment Agency to tackle rising levels of waste crime.  <a href="#">Link to Budget 2017</a></p>	<p><b>Continued rise in landfill tax rates and potential use of tax system to reduce single-use plastic waste.</b></p>

<p><b>Brexit Negotiations</b> Following conclusion of Phase 1 of the talks in December 2017 on the principles of EU withdrawal, discussions are expected to commence at the end of January 2018 on the transition period and future UK – EU relationship following Brexit in March 2019. The EU wants the transition period to end in December 2020 coinciding with the conclusion of the 2014 – 2020 EU budget programme.</p>	<p><b>Uncertainty over the future UK–EU relationship and UK waste and resources policy.</b></p>
<p><b>European Union (Withdrawal) Bill</b> The Bill continued its progress through Parliament on 16 -17<sup>th</sup> January 2018 and is now due to move to the House of Lords where challenges and proposed amendments are anticipated. <a href="#">Link to European Union (Withdrawal) Bill</a></p>	<p><b>Brings EU legislation into UK law at Brexit and allows Government to amend these laws after Brexit without Parliamentary debate.</b></p>
<p><b>Future Government Announcements</b></p> <p><b>HWRC Charging Review</b> revised guidance delayed and now expected from WRAP in early 2018.</p> <p><b>Resources and Waste Strategy</b> to focus on resource efficiency, extended producer responsibility and incentives to reduce waste and tackle litter. Expected later in 2018.</p>	<p><b>Clarification of HWRC charging policy delayed.</b></p> <p><b>Opportunities to develop UK circular economy and resources strategy post Brexit.</b></p>

<b>EU &amp; INTERNATIONAL</b>	
<p><b>EU Circular Economy Package</b>            Provisional agreement on the legislative provisions of the package was reached by Member States and the EU institutions on 18.12.17, including revisions to EU reuse and recycling targets.  <b>Provisional municipal waste reuse and recycling targets are 55% by 2025, 60% by 2030 and 65% by 2035.</b> Final agreed targets should be confirmed by March 2018 with the new legislation transposed into UK law before or at Brexit.  <a href="#">Link to EU Circular Economy Package</a></p>	<p><b>Stepped 5 yearly increase in reuse and recycling targets reaching 65% by 2035.</b></p> <p><b>Calculation methodologies to be confirmed.</b></p> <p><b>Confirmation of revised legislation to follow.</b></p>
<p><b>EU Plastics Strategy</b>            The Strategy, published on 16.01.18, aims to reduce the consumption of single-use plastics and ensure that <b>all plastic packaging on the EU market will be recyclable by 2030.</b> The Strategy forms part of the EU Circular Economy package. Further details of the Plastics Strategy can be found at the link above.</p>	<p><b>Part of EU transition towards a more circular economy and a catalyst for recent UK action on plastics.</b></p>
<p><b>Chinese Waste Import Restrictions</b>            The Chinese Ministry of Environmental Protection introduced <b>restrictions on a range of recyclable waste imports including plastics and paper</b> on 01.01.18.
