Appendix 1 Knowsley Rail Transfer Loading Station The Site

1.0 General

- 1.1 The Authority has made available the use of an area within Knowsley Rail Transfer Loading Station for the undertaking of the Waste Composition Analysis.
- 1.2 The Authority does not give any warranty or undertaking or make any representation (either express or implied) as to the suitability of fitness of the Site.
- 1.3 The Contractor shall be deemed to have satisfied itself in relation to:
 - o The nature, location and condition of the Site and facilities;
 - The means and nature of access through the Rail Transfer Loading Station to the Site.
 - The state and condition of the Site, the facilities and the apparatus and activities therein;
 - All information as to the risks, contingencies, and all other circumstances which may influence the undertaking of the Works at the Site.
- 1.4 The Contractor shall not in any way be relieved from any obligation under this Contract or be entitled to claim against the Authority on grounds that any information, whether obtained from the Authority or otherwise (including information made available to the Authority), is incorrect or insufficient and shall make its own enquiries as to the accuracy and adequacy of that information.
- 2.0 Terms of use from Suez
- 2.1 The Contractor appointed by MWDA to perform the waste composition analysis shall remain a representative of MWDA whilst on site; and MUST abide by the site rules, instruction and policies set out or given by SUEZ. The identified area will be provided for the purposes of waste composition analysis. All contract representatives will provide:
 - RAMs
 - Any relevant training certification
 - Ensure all staff are provided with the appropriate training to undertake the task which will also include the provision of appropriate PPE
- 2.2 The Contractor will complete the following before any works commence:
 - Provide 14 days' notice prior to commencement of sampling/analysis
 - Undertake a Site Induction
 - Complete the Permit to Work
 - Sign off Permit to work on completion of the working day
 - Sign in/out of site

- 2.3 All works to be carried out during normal operational hours (08:00 16:30) Monday to Friday inclusive unless otherwise agreed in writing.
- 2.4 Welfare facilities including the use of showers, toilets/changing facilities and kitchen are available on site for the Contractor use.
- 2.5 Permits to Work are suspended at the end of each day and reopened the following day for a maximum of 5 days each time. Any new Contractors/personnel must be site inducted.
