The ban on plastic straws, stirrers and cotton buds will now start in October 2020 following Parliamentary approval on 15.06.20. The ban was originally planned from April 2020 but has been delayed due to Covid.	
Waste Strategy: Implications for LAs - Government response to Parliamentary Report The Government response, published on 19.05.20, is in line with proposals for implementing recycling consistency measures from 2023. Government also re-emphasised that householders should not be charged at HWRCs for 'DIY waste' and this will be clarified in a Controlled Waste Regulations review. Link to Government response	
Brexit Negotiations on the future UK–EU relationship began in March 2020, with the UK seeking a Free Trade Agreement with the EU. On 15.06.20 the UK confirmed it would not seek a further extension to the Brexit transition period due to end 31.12.20 and would be prepared to leave the transition without a deal. Negotiations are expected to intensify from July towards a possible deal in the autumn.
