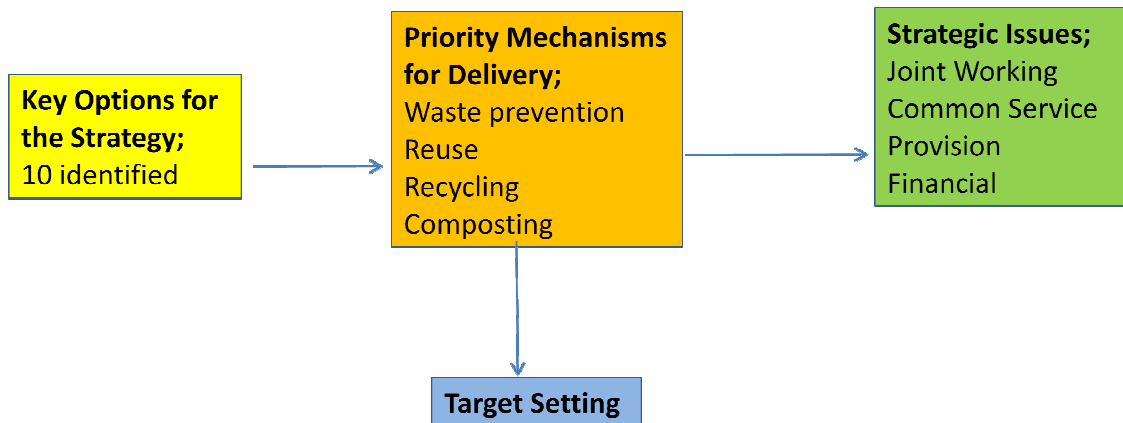
Joint Municipal Waste Management Strategy for Merseyside

Introduction

Issues and Options Study – Member Consultation

The purpose of the workshop is to consult with members to agree the Issues and Options that will be taken forward for more detailed work and subsequently be the subject of a public consultation.

Overview of the Issues and Options Process:



The work to date by district officers and MWDA at a workshop on the 2nd March has produced a short list of 10 key options which, subject to member approval, will drive the strategy and the associated priority mechanisms for delivery. These delivery mechanisms relate primarily to waste prevention, reuse, recycling, composting with residual waste being handled through the current procurement process. A number of headline targets that will also drive the strategy are proposed. Other strategic issues that relate to the provision of services and activities of the Partnership authorities will be presented.
